What qualification will I achieve?

The successful candidates will be working towards a Level 3 Diploma in Electrical Installation. This will be taken via Gloucester College (GlosCol)

What skills and qualifications do I need?

Applicants must have:

- A Level 2 qualification in Electrical Installation or equivalent.
- 5 GCSE grade C or above including Maths and English. If you don't meet these grades, we still want you to apply as we look at the whole application, and you might have the practical skills that we are looking for!
- Other relevant subjects such as Design and Technology would be an advantage.
- Make sure your CV is up to date with details of qualifications you are currently studying towards, including full titles and levels. You can include predicted grades if you have not completed your studies yet.
- A current or recent job, this does not need to be relevant to building or maintenance.

- Relevant work experience done through school or college would be beneficial although is not essential.
- A genuine interest and enthusiasm to undertake a practical, hands-on role in a building maintenance environment.
- Enthusiasm, motivation and a positive attitude, pride in a job well done, and the commitment to put in the time and effort during the apprenticeship to reap the benefits when the apprenticeship ends.
